

The seat of His Holiness the Dalai Lama and the Tibetan Government-In-Exile, Dharamsala is the cultural and intellectual capital of the Tibetan exile community. It is also where the Library of Tibetan Works and Archives (LTWA) is based. It is where LTWA in collaboration with the Office of Tibet in New York organizes a six-week Summer Study for Tibetan university students and young professionals living abroad.

The LTWA was founded by His Holiness the Dalai Lama in 1970 with the primary objectives of promoting a comprehensive cultural resource center and promoting an environment that encourages research and an exchange of knowledge between scholars and students. The Program:

The Six-Week Summer Study Program is aimed towards providing an opportunity for university students and young professionals to understand the essence of Buddhism, to have an overview of Tibetan history, and to learn their native language.

Apart from the above, the program will also provide an opportunity for the participants to learn about other aspects of Tibetan culture through special lectures and interaction with scholars and students.

The Program will start from June 1st and end on July 15th 2011. The tentative program will include:

Buddhism:

2) Thirty-seven Bodhisattva Practices by Ngulchu Thogme Sangpo

Participants must read the book, "Leaders's Way - Business, Buddhism and Happiness in an Interconnected World", authored by His Holiness the Dalai Lama, before they attend this Summer Study Program.

Weekly Talk on other aspect of Tibetan culture

Eligibility:

The program is restricted to university students and young professionals.

Accommodation:

The participants are encouraged to arrange their own accommodation. However, the LTWa will also assist, on request, the participants to find accommodation in and around Mcleod Ganj and Gangchen Kyishong.

Program Cost:

The registration fee will be US\$250. This will include books, tuition, tea and snacks during the sessions.
